MAIN THEME IN THIS WEEK'S LESSON

A. Dealing with oppression and injustice, taking care of the poor, respecting the rights of the people

- "Every attempt to take advantage of the ignorance, weakness, or misfortune of another is registered as fraud in the ledger of heaven. He who truly fears God, would rather toil day and night, and eat the bread of poverty, than to indulge the passion for gain that oppresses the widow and fatherless or turns the stranger from his right." {PK 651.3}
- We were all debtors to divine justice, but we had nothing with which to pay the debt. Then the Son of God, who pitied us, paid the price of our redemption. He became poor that through His poverty we might be rich. By deeds of liberality toward His poor we may prove the sincerity of our gratitude for the mercy extended to us. "Let us do good unto all men," the apostle Paul enjoins, "especially unto them who are of the household of faith." Galatians 6:10. And his words accord with those of the Saviour: "Ye have the poor with you always, and whensoever ye will ye may do them good." At the writing of this hymn, Bryan Jeffery Leech said, "At first all I could think of was the terrible plight of the needy people, of starving bodies and the ravages of drought, which did not seem suitable subjects for a hymn. And then I thought of what our reaction to such things should be, and immediately the recurring idea of 'Let Your Heart Be Broken' was born."

Let the song leader especially highlight the line in 4th stanza which says, "In the world's great trouble -- risk yourself for God." This aptly describes Nehemiah, as well as what our responsibility should be toward the needs of the world around us.

As a result, his leadership influenced a change of heart among the Hebrews.

Song leader can emphasize this thought by reading the 3rd stanza or having the congregation say it in unison.
