RECURRING THEMES IN THIS WEEK'S LESSON

A. The prophetic importance of Ezra's timeline:

- Tracing the the starting date (457 BC) of the 70-week prophecy is important to be able to predict key dates in the Bible (as Daniel foretold) -- Messiah's death on the cross (AD 31), and the preaching of the gospel extends to the Gentiles, marked by the persecution of the early church and the martyrdom of Stephen (AD 34)
- It also helped the early Adventists predict the time for the end of the 2300-day prophecy, hence the significance of October 22, 2844 -not because of the Great Disappointment, but it marked Christ's entry into the Most Holy Place, bearing the High Priest's role, and interceding in behalf of His people.

B. Biblical concepts of predestination:

 God predestined that there is only one way of salvation, namely, through Jesus Christ (John 14:6, Acts 4:12).

RECURRING THEMES IN THIS WEEK'S LESSON

B. Biblical concepts of predestination (continued)

- God predestined some people (both as individuals or as a community of believers) to a specific task, to a particular mission (as He ordained the faithful remnant to proclaim the eternal gospel).
- God has a worldwide mission (Isa. 49:6) God has predestined the final climax of human history when He will come as Judge and give His reward (Daniel 2).
- God predestined humans to be conformed to the image of His Son. The Bible is not saying that God predestines us either to be saved or to be condemned, and that we have no choice in the matter. In other words, the election is for the purpose of our transformation. We are to be changed to reflect the Son of God.

There are times God prepares us, through education or experiences, for a specific task; at other times, He chooses us to serve simply because we are willing and humble. It's not always easy to know, though, what God's call is in our lives, is it? Nevertheless, the Bible is full of stories of people whom God chose for a particular assignment.

Interestingly, Ezra and Nehemiah were called for a specific task by God: to rebuild what lay in ruins. However, rebuilding in this case involved various tasks. They were to lead the people of Israel back to Jerusalem and to rebuild the temple and the city. At the same time, they were to teach the people about God and above all guide them back to a committed relationship with Him.

How about you, what do you think is God calling you to do? When He calls, our response should be what Daniel March wrote in the 4th stanza of this hymn:

While the souls of men are dying, and the Master calls for you, Let none hear you idly saying, "There is nothing I can do!" Gladly take the task He gives you, Let His work your pleasure be; Answer quickly when He callers, "Here am I, O Lord, send me."
